

Exploring the promise of God for all

Olivier Messiaen (1908-1992) was the organist at the Sainte Trinité church in Paris from 1931 until his death. A prolific composer of all genres, he had a unique harmonic system that utilized different scales than we typically hear in western music, which he called "modes of limited transposition." Messiaen's Roman Catholic faith inspired much of his organ compositions, which tonally depict different scripture verses or Christian doctrines.

Messiaen first composed The Ascension as "four meditations for orchestra" in 1932, later publishing it for organ in 1934. He transcribed movements 1, 2, and 4, but composed an entirely new movement 3 for the 1934 organ version. This morning's prelude, "Majesty of Christ," is one of the transcribed movements.

Choir sings the refrain, all repeat. All sing refrain as noted:

God has gone up with a shout, — the

Choir: Clap your hands, all you peoples; shout to God with a cry of joy. For the Lord Most High is to be feared; the great Sovereign over all the earth.

The Lord subdues the peoples under us, and the nations under our feet; the Lord chooses our inheritance for us, the pride of the beloved Jacob.

All: Refrain

READING

Acts 1:1-11

Luke writes: ¹In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning ²until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father.

“This,” he said, “is what you have heard from me; ⁵for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.”

⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, “Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?” ⁷He replied, “It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.”

⁴⁴Jesus said to the eleven and those with them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you – that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.”⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures,⁴⁶and he said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day,⁴⁷and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.”

⁵⁰Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. ⁵¹While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. ⁵²And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; ⁵³and they were continually in the temple blessing God.
