Exploring the promise of God for all

Durufié (1902-1986) was the Titular Organist at the Church of Saint-Étienne-du-Mont in Paris. Though influential, his compositional output was quite small due to his intense perfectionism. Durufié wrote his Scherzo, Op. 2 in 1926 under the guidance of Charles Tournemire, his teacher at the time and its dedicatee. This piece served as Durufié's entrance exam for the Paris Conservatory composition class.



*Stanford (1852-1924) was a prolific
composer of both instrumental
and choral music. Born in Ireland,
he studied in Dublin, Cambridge,
Leipzig and Berlin. In 1883, he was
appointed Professor of Composition
at the Royal College of Music in
London, and in 1887, Professor of
Music at Cambridge University.*

*The third and final movement of his
Sonata "Celtica" is based on the
tune "Saint Patrick's Breastplate,"
which can be found in the ELW
hymnal, #450. The trinitarian first
stanza reads: "I bind unto myself
today the strong name of the Trinity
by invocation of the same, the Three
in One and One in Three."*
